## EMERGENCY SHELTERS

Know where your emergency shelters are located. Many are located in schools and churches. You should also know where the shelters are located for your individual schools and work places. Have these numbers and locations available. Many shelters do not accept pets. Have an alternative plan for you and your pets, possibly with an out of town relative or friend.

Keep personal information available to include names, birthdates, social security numbers, school addresses and contact numbers, work addresses and contact numbers. Keep this information in your emergency kit, and take the time to update the information regularly. Keep important medical information as well as extra medications in your emergency kit. List your doctors, and pharmacist names and numbers. Your emergency kit should be maintained in an airtight container that is easily transportable if you would have to evacuate. Prepare now, don't wait for an emergency to gather your important information and documents.

Remember to tune to your emergency broadcast radio and television stations for specific instructions during any emergency. Shelter locations could be changed due to specific emergency needs.

## Preparing Makes Sense Make a Kit of emergency supplies

Be prepared to improvise and use what you have on hand to make it on your own for at least three days. Include provisions for pets.

### Recommended Supplies to Include in a Basic Kit:

- **Water** one gallon/person/day for drinking & sanitation
- **Food** at least three day supply of non-perishables
- **Blankets/Sleeping Bags** for warmth and dryness
- **Flashlight, Radio, and extra batteries**
- **First Aid kit** containing everyday supplies
- **Whistle to signal for help**
- **Filter mask** or cotton t-shirt to help filter air
- **Moist towelettes** for sanitation
- **Toiletries, wash cloths & towels**
- **Wrench or pliers** to turn off utilities
- **Manual can opener** for canned foods
- **Plastic sheeting & duct tape** to shelter-in-place
- **Garbage bags and plastic ties** for personal sanitation
- **Family-specific needs:** at least three to five day supply daily prescription medications, medical devices, infant formula, and diapers.
- **Change of clothing, shoes and socks**
- **Important documents**

## MAKE A PLAN

Make sure your family has an emergency plan.

Sit down together and decide how you will get in contact with each other; where you will go and what you will do in an emergency. Use common sense.

Your family may not be together when disaster strikes. Consider a plan where each family member calls, or emails, the same friend or relative. An out of town contact may be best.

Keep a copy of your plan in your emergency kit.

Develop a plan to shelter in place, as well as a plan for evacuation.
